History of Father's Day

Some attribute the first Father's Day observance to the 1907 West Virginia mining disaster that killed 361 men - 250 of them fathers and which left more than a thousand children without a dad. Grace Clayton, whose father was killed in the tragedy, suggested a service of commemoration but it never caught on as an annual observance.Two years later in 1909, Sonora Dodd of Washington heard a Mother's Day sermon and thought a similar day should be set aside to honor father's.
